# SE METTRE AU *VERT*

## Maxime Biou

For the start of the 2024 season, pal project presents its first exhibition of the painter of the intimate, Maxime Biou, who recently spent time at the Villa Velasquez. On this occasion, he has left the studio with a brand new series. From September 5 to October 5, 'Se mettre au vert' will show landscapes that retain the poetry and melancholy characteristic of the artist's universe.

Se mettre au vert...

For several years now, Maxime Biou's work has been capturing our attention. Or perhaps it's more accurate to say it gently inserts itself into our daily lives, bringing with it the beauty of everyday moments.

This collection of soft yet powerful images, a testament to the painter's talent and empathy, has found its way into our imaginations, with its animals, plants, and effortlessly posed portraits. But this new exhibition at PAL Project offers something different: instead of engaging with his usual subjects, Maxime invites us to embark on a journey—to «se mettre au vert.»

In this new series of landscapes, created specifically for the exhibition, Biou dives deeper into a theme he had previously only skimmed. Inspired by the environment of his new life after returning from the Casa de Velázquez—set in the charming village of Marolles and its surroundings, from the banks of the Ourcq canal to La Ferté-Milon—Maxime returns to the basics: the earth and its poetry, which sometimes dances with a touch of melancholy. Along his meandering paths, the painter gathers inspiration to enrich his work, always with the element that makes his art so unique: his most faithful companion, light.

In this green, tranquil pause, we find landscapes like those of Bagnolet, the pond at Parc des Guilands, and even his relaxed cat lounging on a cozy sofa—all perfect excuses to masterfully play with the impasto that defines Maxime Biou's art. And that Norman beach «borrowed» from the skies over Cabourg seems to have a natural dialogue with a view of Lozère, another geographic witness to the artist's meditative daily walks. As you can tell, this new and surprising chapter in the painter's journey is sure to bring us joy... in a refreshingly

new way!

### **MAXIME BIOU**

Maxime Biou graduated from the École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts in Paris, where he studied for five years in François Boisrond's studio. He began painting shortly before enrolling at the École, initially working almost exclusively from life, using his friends and everyday elements as models. It was only later that he incorporated photographic references into his creative process, granting him greater freedom.

A painter of spontaneity, Maxime Biou acts as a witness to the moments he captures. The narratives in his paintings are more implied than explicitly stated. The key lies in the relationship that forms between the viewer and what the work, its treatment, and its material evoke. Thus, Maxime Biou does not impose interpretation on the viewer; instead, he allows ample space for it to develop and take root.

His work has received numerous awards: the Diamond Grant, the Friends of the Beaux-Arts Prize/Bertrand de Demandolx Prize, the Yishu 8 Prize, the Fénéon Artistic Prize, and the Encouragement Prize in Painting from the Academy of Fine Arts.

Recently, his work has been featured in several group exhibitions, including the 2019 show of the laureates of the Emerige Revelation Grant – *L'effet falaise* – after which the National Museum of the History of Immigration acquired his painting *Les naufragés* for its permanent collection.\*


In 2021-2022, Maxime was an artist-in-residence at the Casa de Velázquez, Académie de France in Madrid. In late 2023, he was in residence at the Beijing House of Arts, invited by Yishu8.
